NOTICE TO BIDDERS

The City of Celina will receive sealed bids for the Kessler Lift Station Replacement Project.

Bids will be received in the office of the Safety Service Director, 426 West Market Street, Celina, OH 45822, until 2:00 p.m. (local time), July 14, 2009, at which time and place bids will be opened publicly and read aloud. Bids received after 2:00 p.m. (local time) will be returned unopened.

A Unit Price bid will be considered for:

Total Construction Costs - Base Bid A

Bids must be signed and submitted on the separate bidding forms included in the Bidding Documents, sealed in the provided envelope, and shall be accompanied by either a Bid Guaranty Bond in the amount of 100% of the Bid amount or by a certified check, cashier's check, or letter of credit on a solvent bank in the amount of not less than 10% of the amount of the Bid, subject to conditions provided in the Instructions to Bidders. The successful BIDDER will be required to furnish a satisfactory Performance Bond in the amount of 100% of the Bid.

Attention of Bidders is called to all of the requirements contained in this bid packet, particularly to the State of Ohio Prevailing Wage Rates for Public Improvements in Mercer County and the City of Celina, Ohio as determined by the Ohio Bureau of Employment Services, Wage and Hour Division, (614) 644-2239, various insurance requirements, various equal opportunity provisions, and the requirement for a payment bond and performance bond for 100 percent of the contract price.

The Bidding Documents, which include drawings and specifications may be examined and obtained at the office of Fanning/Howey Civil Engineering Division, 1200 Irmischer Blvd., Celina, OH 45822. Bidders may obtain copies of the documents from the Engineer for \$60.00 for each complete set of documents. Non-refundable checks are to be payable to Fanning/Howey Associates, Inc.

The Owner reserves the right to reject each and every bid and to waive informalities, irregularities, and errors in the bidding to the extent permitted by law.

No bidder may withdraw his bid within 60 days after the actual date of the opening thereof.
