HAPPY MAY!

After a harsh winter, we are finally entering “construction” season in the City. Along with multiple road surface repairs, our first major Street project is the replacement of waterlines, storm sewers, curbs and gutters in North Main Street with project boundaries of Fulton Street to Myers Road. This project has been awarded to VTF Excavating for approximately \$1.6M and will be completed prior to ODOT resurfacing in 2020. The second major project to bid is the East Livingston Street Reconstruction Project that will span from Main Street to Grand Lake Road. This project will be awarded after July 1st to comply with grant requirements.



The City’s residential limbs and brush collection will begin Monday, April 2nd and be conducted on the first Monday of the month through October.

Only limbs and brush without root balls will be collected. Limbs and brush are not to be placed adjacent to the street earlier than three (3) days prior to the scheduled collection, nor after the street has been collected. An effort should be made by all to keep our community looking neat. Limbs must be stacked in piles with larger sections of limbs facing the same direction.

A **three cubic yard limit** has been established for each residence per pickup. That is equal to a pile three feet wide by three feet high by nine feet long.

Brush and limbs in excess of the three cubic yard limit will not be collected and are the responsibility of the property owner to dispose of.

City crews will make only one trip through the City each month and, once your neighborhood is collected, will not return until the next regularly scheduled collection. You are prohibited from putting brush, limbs or debris on the street.

IF YOU HAVE YOUR TREES TRIMMED, YOUR CONTRACTOR MUST REMOVE THE LIMBS/BRUSH.

In the new Bryson Park District the proposed Amphitheater is out for bid with the construction contract being awarded this month. The much anticipated Splash Pad will also be constructed this summer in the District. The Challenge Course will be installed in Eastview Park with a new Shelter House being built at the Bryson Pool.

As always, construction projects create some hazards for both motorists and pedestrians. Please note areas of Caution and Road Closed signs that are placed for your protection.

Celina Utilities Shut-off Policy

Prompt payment of your utility bills to avoid getting your services shut off is important. Any customer with a past-due account balance is subject to disconnect. Customers can determine their account status by checking their monthly utility bill. If your bill indicates you are in disconnect status, prompt payment is necessary to avoid having your utilities turned off.

Payments can be made to the Celina Utilities office with cash, check, automatic deduction from your bank account, or credit card. A night deposit box is located outside of the front doors for payment after working hours.

If you have any questions or are unsure of your account status, please contact the Celina Utilities office at 419-586-2311.

Any customer who has had their utilities turned off due to nonpayment, must make payment with cash or money order to be reconnected.

Need Transportation? 60 years or older?

Transportation is available to Mercer County residents who are 60 years or older. The Mercer County Council on Aging provides in-county rides to doctor appointments, hair appointments, banking, and grocery shopping, as well as to the on-site meal and activities at the Senior Center. In addition, transportation is provided to medical appointments within 40-mile radius outside of the county. Appointments must fall between the times of 8:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m. Please contact the Mercer County Council on Aging at 419-586-1644 for more information or to schedule a ride. You must give 24 hour notice for in-county transportation needs and 48 hour notice for out-of-county needs.
